A true immunologic reaction to a local anesthetic is rare. Intradermal skin testing of local anesthetic compounds, methylparaben, and metabisulfite should be performed in patients when a thorough history does not rule out a possible allergic reaction to local anesthetics and future local anesthesia ...

TYPES OF ALLERGIC REACTIONS TO LOCAL ANESTHETICS. Two distinct types of allergic reactions to LAs have been described: Allergic contact dermatitis and delayed swelling at the site of administration - These types of reactions are uncommon but well-established. They begin hours after injection and usually peak within 72 hours.

Local anaesthetics. Allergic reactions to local anaesthetics are rare despite their frequent use. It is estimated that <1% of all reactions to local anaesthetics have an allergic mechanism . Inadvertent intravascular injection leading to excessive blood concentrations of the local anaesthetic, or systemic absorption of epinephrine that was ...

Anesthesia represents a pharmacologically unique situation, during which patients are exposed to multiple foreign substances including anesthetics, analgesics, antibiotics, antiseptics, blood products, heparin, polypeptides, and intravascular volume expanders, which can produce immediate hypersensitivity reactions or anaphylaxis.

Reactions occur in two groups, those with significant previous exposure and those with an atopic predisposition. The prevalence of sensitization is 10% among healthcare workers and 15% in anaesthetic staff, 9 but not all these individuals exhibit clinical allergy. Children undergoing repeated operations with high latex exposure or repeated bladder catheterization (e.g. spina bifida) have a 40-50% risk of sensitization.

Serious allergic reactions to anesthetic medications are rare and a usually attributable to factors other than the anesthetic. Neuromuscular blocking agents, natural rubber latex, and antibiotics are the most common causes of serious allergic reactions during surgery. The mortality rate from these reactions ranges between 3-9%.

Symptoms of an allergic reaction to sulfa drugs include rash or hives, itchy skin or eyes, and swelling. Complications of sulfa allergy include anaphylaxis and Steven-Johnson syndrome.

Most anaphylactic reactions are allergic. Severity is commonly graded 1-5, although multiple grading systems exist. Mild reactions, Grades 1 and 2, do not constitute anaphylaxis. The 6th National Audit Project (NAP6) investigated Grades 3-5 reactions occurring in the perioperative period.

Other reactions, particularly rashes, can occur hours, days or weeks later. Drug allergy signs and symptoms may include: Skin rash; Hives; Itching; Fever; Swelling; Shortness of breath; Wheezing; Runny nose; Itchy, watery eyes; Anaphylaxis. Anaphylaxis is a rare, life-threatening reaction to a drug allergy that causes the widespread dysfunction of body systems.

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
