There are many factors that may place students at risk and contribute to a student's decision to drop out of school. These include school, community, and family related factors. In many cases, no one factor leads to a student's decision to drop out, rather it is a combination of factors. Overview - Dropout Reduction: Prevention, Intervention ...

Students who more often get low grades, fail subjects, and are retained in grade are more likely to leave school prior to graduation. Students experiencing difficulty meeting the academic demands of the school tend to leave rather than continue in the face of the frustration of failing to achieve good grades.

Dropout Risk Factors and Exemplary Programs

The research findings concluded that school factors that causes dropout among pupils included fear of teachers, excessive corporal punishment, overcrowded classrooms, ineffective teaching, persistence poor performance, long distance from school, lack of food provision in school and poor administration.

Causes of School Dropout Among Students in Nigeria ...

Factors contributing to secondary school outcome as well as a strong predictor of the future social and economic success of students. It is estimated that dropouts have cost the state of Mississippi a substantial amount in terms of higher crime and incarceration rates, increased welfare, and more dependence on public welfare (Wright, 2008).

The study established that more than three quarters 75 (78.1%) of the teachers who took part in the survey accepted that very harsh school climate can make a pupil drop out of school and another 60 (62.5%) of them also held that a harsh head teacher can make pupils drop out of school.

School Based Factors Influencing Drop out among Primary ...

The study found that, for all the learners interviewed, 50% of learners dropped out due to. pregnancy, 20% dropped out due to economic factors, 15% due to system factors, 11% due. to lack of parental involvement, and 4% due to cultural factors. On the basis of the.
