The placement of punctuation marks before or after a closing quotation mark varies. American English always places periods (full stops) and commas inside the quotation marks, "like so." British English generally places the periods (full stops) and commas after the quotation marks, "like so", except in dialogue, where punctuation would go inside the quotation marks: "like so," he said.
